WHEN TO GO

Come during baseball season so you can experience a game at iconic Fluor Field in the historic West End neighborhood. The 6,700-seat baseball stadium houses the Greenville Drive baseball team, the A affiliate of the Boston Red Sox, and replicates the dimensions of Fenway Park. Stay for our iconic Saturday Market, showcasing the best of our local produce and vendors right along our picturesque Main Street. Market runs Saturdays from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., May through October.
