## **WHEN TO GO**

## **WHERE TO STAY**

### **St. Regis Hotel**

*88 West Paces Ferry Road Northwest*

A five-star hotel in Atlanta's stylish Buckhead District. From the sophisticated atmosphere to luxurious features like the renowned spa, you'll fall in love with all the hotel has to offer.

## **WHAT TO DO**

### **High Museum of Art**

*1280 Peachtree Street Northeast*

Located in the heart of Midtown, the building itself is a modern architectural gem. Inside, the museum displays a mix of old and new work.

### **Miami Circle for Art and Antiques**

*Miami Circle*

This street has an abundance of art galleries and shops that sell one-of-a-kind home decor pieces. Spending an afternoon walking around Miami Circle is an absolute must.

### **Pancake Social**

*675 Ponce De Leon  
Avenue Northeast*

### **Le Bilboquet**

Located in the Buckhead Village District, this French eatery feels truly Parisian. Chances are you will want a glass of Champagne to go along with your memorable meal.

## **LOCAL PRO-TIP**

### **Scott's Antique Show.**

Happening the second weekend of every month, the locals (and in-the-know visitors) know to scope out Scott's for great finds, from antiques to jewelry, art, and clothes.
